Ellerslie Train Station Improvements

Quick facts

- A new, modern Ellerslie Train Station
- Joint project by NZ Transport Agency, Auckland Transport and KiwiRail
- Cost: \$8 million
- Started: November 2011
- Completed: May 2012



Station was last upgraded in 2008 and has been located at Ellerslie since 1874

Benefits

- Safer, more attractive train station
- Better access for mobility users and pedestrians
- Improved access to the station platform from Kalmia Street
- Future proofing for an additional motorway lane between Ellerslie and Greenlane











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Key features

- Two new lifts: one giving access to Kalmia Street from the rail overbridge, one giving direct access to the station platform
- Facilities on the platform have been revamped with all new furniture
- A new shelter to protect from wet weather
- A new pedestrian bridge and new stairs have replaced the old stone ramp



- New rubbish bins, CCTV, PA system and HOP ticketing machine
- Existing platform width reduced by two metres to give space for the future motorway lane between Ellerslie and Greenlane
- Pedestrian bridge was rebuilt to allow clearance for electrification masts and overhead wires

Improving public transport

- NZ Transport Agency, Auckland Transport and KiwiRail worked together to save time, money and disruption to passengers
- Station was upgraded now in preparation for electrification of the rail network next year
- Improvements are part of an effort to upgrade



- rail facilities across Auckland, to encourage more people to use public transport
- Designed to look similar to stations at Kingsland and Sylvia Park
