




Marshland to Burwood safety improvements



We are looking at ways to make State Highway 74 safer for everyone. This project is part of the Safe Roads and Roadsides programme that is underway to help prevent people from dying or being seriously injured on our rural roads.

Making your road safer





One person has died and 13 people have been seriously injured*

QEII Drive from Innes Road to Burwood Road has been identified as a road that can be made safer. New residential developments and the opening of Avonside Girls' High and Shirley Boys' High at QEII Park in early 2019 mean this section of road will only get busier.

What's happening, and when?

We are looking at early 2018 to start work installing the safety improvements. Over the coming weeks we will be sharing information with people in the community on the safety improvements planned.

We will be working closely with the Christchurch Northern Corridor (CNC) team to make the road safer for people who connect to, or from the CNC at the Innes Road roundabout.

Flexible road safety barriers

Reduce road deaths by 70-80%* by catching you before you hit something less forgiving.

Keeping people safe

Roadside barriers will keep vehicles away from the pathway shared by pedestrians and cyclists.
