Request made under the Official Information Act 1982

Thank you for your email of 25 June 2015 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982:

- all information provided to NZTA's vehicle fleet manager related to travel in excess of speed limits as recorded by GPS installed on fleet cars;
- briefings to the chief executive or management team about such travel;
- briefings to the minister about such travel
- how many vehicles NZTA owns/leases/rents'.

In response to your request we have provided the GPS data from October 2014 to June 2015 and the reports provided to our Senior Leadership team in March 2015. No briefings have been made to the Minister on such travel.

The NZ Transport Agency fleet has a fleet that includes different vehicle models and is a mix of pool and dedicated vehicles; 146 of which are leased while one is owned by the Transport Agency. Our vehicles are branded and 139 out of 146 of our leased vehicles now have GPS.

Certain information has been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act 1982 to protect the privacy of natural persons.

With respect to the information that has been withheld, I do not consider the necessity to protect privacy is outweighed by other considerations which render it desirable, in the public interest, to make the information available.

Under section 28(3) of the Official Information Act 1982, you have the right to apply to an Ombudsman for an investigation and review of the decision to withhold this information.
