Variation to Interim Speed Management Plan under Section 3.7 (4-5) of the Setting of Speed Limit Rule 2022

The Northland Transportation Alliance, as the Far North Road Controlling Authority (Far North District Council) are seeking to certify some changes to existing Interim Speed Management Plans in the Far North.

The speed limits in this area were reviewed in accordance with the Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2017. Public notification occurred in accordance with the Local Government Act 2002 and the Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2017. The Far North District Council adopted the changes prior to the 2022 Setting of speed Limits Rule coming into effect.

The 2022 Rule introduces changes relating to speed limits near schools. Certification of new speed limits as set out below recognises the 2022 Rule and enables changes to be implemented at a similar time to the remainder of the catchment area and avoids multiple speed limit changes over a short period of time.

Review Triggers

The Ministry of Education advised the Far North District Council of a new school on Wireless Road (within the North Hokianga catchment speed review area). This school was due to open in 2023. An assessment of the new school indicated that it would be a Category 1 School under the Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2022.

As part of the wider assessment of schools for the upcoming Regional Speed Management Plan, it was identified that several other schools within the same catchment area would not be compliant with he 2022 Rule. A decision was therefore made to update the speed limits outside these schools so that signage could be incorporated into current contracts.

At the same time, two Marae (near Pukepoto School) were identified as needing a variable speed limit. This requirement followed on from earlier consultation, however a variable speed limit was not able to be implemented under the 2017 Rule. In addition, two other roads, Sandhills Road and Pungaere Road are also included for changes due to an error in the ISMP, or in the case of Pungaere Road, a change to the road environment.



Process Summary

The proposed changes to speed limits outside schools is highly localised and considered a minor change. This is reflected in the consultation process undertaken.

The proposed changes to speed limits outside the affected schools and marae was publicly notified on 10th July 2023, with feedback sought by 9th August 2023.

Notification included:

Flyers for each proposed speed limit change. The Flyer set out what changes were being proposed and why. The Flyer also set out the options and how to provide feedback.

Flyers were mailed (or emailed) to the local community near the school, including:

- Residents
- Marae if one was present.
- The school
- Businesses within the immediate area of the school.

Notification, including the Flyers and associated maps were included on Councils website.

Where requested, NTA staff undertook a site visit with submitters.

The notification and consultation process undertaken meets and exceeds the minimum requirements of Section 82 of the LGA 2002 and the Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2022 and is further documented in the attached Recommendations Report to Council.

Council's Te Koukou - Transport Committee adopted the recommended speed limits at its meeting on 30 October 2023 (Minutes of decision below).







