


# Engagement focus throughout business case development

### Planning the approach to engagement

Initial engagement may be used to:

- plan engagement approach and scope work needed
- identify stakeholders, and collaborate where possible to scope the business case
- understand the level of significance of the project for Māori partners.

Engage to:

Engage to:

- refine and confirm the preferred option, including statutory consultation
- support landowners and involve partners and the community in construction management plans.
