Because the large steel gantries are currently being produced, not all closure dates are confirmed. Here's what we know so far:

CLOSURES OF WELLINGTON'S URBAN MOTORWAY

An important part of putting the smarts into our urban motorway is installing the new overhead gantries that house the fixed and electronic signs. Four existing gantries are being refurbished, one is being removed and eight brand new gantries are being installed. In order to install the new gantries and to help a concrete 'stitch' cure, we need to close State Highway 1 between Ngauranga and the Terrace Tunnel several times and the State Highway 2 off-ramp once.

Some of the closures require partial road closures involving one or two lanes. But some will need full closure of all northbound or southbound lanes, or both directions.

The closures will be between four and 12 hours long.

During the full closures, alternate routes will be in place and they'll be well sign-posted.









FIRST CLOSURE - 1 AUGUST

The first and most significant closure will take place from 10pm, Saturday 1 August. State Highway 1 will be closed in both directions from 10pm Saturday between Thorndon and Ngauranga.

The southbound closure is to install two gantries that will house fixed directional signs and will be opened by 6am, but the northbound direction will remain closed until approximately 10am on Sunday 2 August.

The 12 hour northbound closure is required to reduce vibration on the Thorndon Overbridge while the concrete, which is used to 'stitch' the old off-ramp at Kaiwharawhara to the main Thorndon Overbridge structure, cures.

From 7pm on Saturday 1 August, leading up to the full northbound closure, we'll close one lane as we set up to pour the concrete that connects the structures. The motorway will be fully closed by 10pm.

DETOURS

During the closures we encourage drivers to avoid the area if possible or allow extra time for their journeys.

For northbound journeys, we'll advise drivers at Cobham Drive to use an alternate route, eg the waterfront roads, leading to the Hutt Road.

We'll also advise drivers at the Basin Reserve and at Willis St to use the waterfront route, avoiding the Terrace Tunnel. After the Terrace Tunnel, all vehicles will be diverted off the motorway at the Tinakori off-ramp to head along Tinakori Road and then the Hutt Road. Drivers will be able to re-join State Highway 1 or 2 at Ngauranga.

During southbound closures, vehicles will be diverted off at Ngauranga, along the Hutt Road and back into the city on various routes from there. Access to the motorway southbound will be available from the Hawkestone St on-ramp.
