


ASHHURST TRAFFIC MITIGATION PROJECT

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE NEXT FEW MONTHS?

VILLAGE CENTRE

In March we plan to start installing a raised intersection and two raised platforms in the village centre. Made from precast ramps, they will act like large speed bumps and will help encourage drivers to slow down as they travel along Cambridge Avenue. The new slow speed environment will make it safer for school children and others to cross the road and encourage people to stop for a break and enjoy the Ashhurst town centre. We're also going to do some landscaping work and install new bike racks. We will be working closely with the local business owners and residents to minimise disruption.

SALISBURY STREET

We're focused on calming traffic, reducing noise and making Salisbury Street safer.

We are widening the footpath on the eastern side of Salisbury Street and constructing new sections of footpath to create a safe place for pedestrians and cyclists.

Our crews are working block by block, starting from the Mulgrave Street end and working north.

We are also planning to construct kerb buildouts along the sides of Salisbury Street. These buildouts are used in towns around New Zealand to calm traffic. They let motorists know they are in a residential area and that they need to slow down.

We have been working with local residents to decide on the best places to add these.

Sections of the road shoulder will be closed during this work, which we expect will be finished by early May.

BAMFIELD, LINCOLN, WORCESTER TRAFFIC CALMING

People living in these quiet, residential streets are having issues with the extra traffic travelling past their homes. This year we will start to change the Bamfield Street, Lincoln Street and Worcester Street intersections, where they meet with Stanford Street and Cambridge Avenue. This will include narrowing the intersections to promote slower vehicle speeds and changing the priority to Stanford Street. We want to discourage drivers from using these roads to rat-run and overtake slower vehicles.
