

AIRPORT TO BOTANY RAPID TRANSIT



PROJECT OVERVIEW

This project will deliver a fast, frequent, reliable and affordable public transport system between the airport, Manukau and Botany.

It will significantly improve transport choice and journey times in the south and east of Auckland – as well as provide an important public transport link to the rail network at Puhinui. Neighbouring centres like Ōtara and Ormiston will be able to connect into the rapid transit system using local services.

WE WILL IDENTIFY HOW WE CAN

- improve transport options for people
- provide a public transport link to the city centre, as well as south and east Auckland via Puhinui bus/rail interchange
- support growth opportunities at key locations along the route
- improve access to major employment areas
- reduce the effects on the environment and treasured places/taonga.

PROJECT STAGES

The project will be delivered in stages.

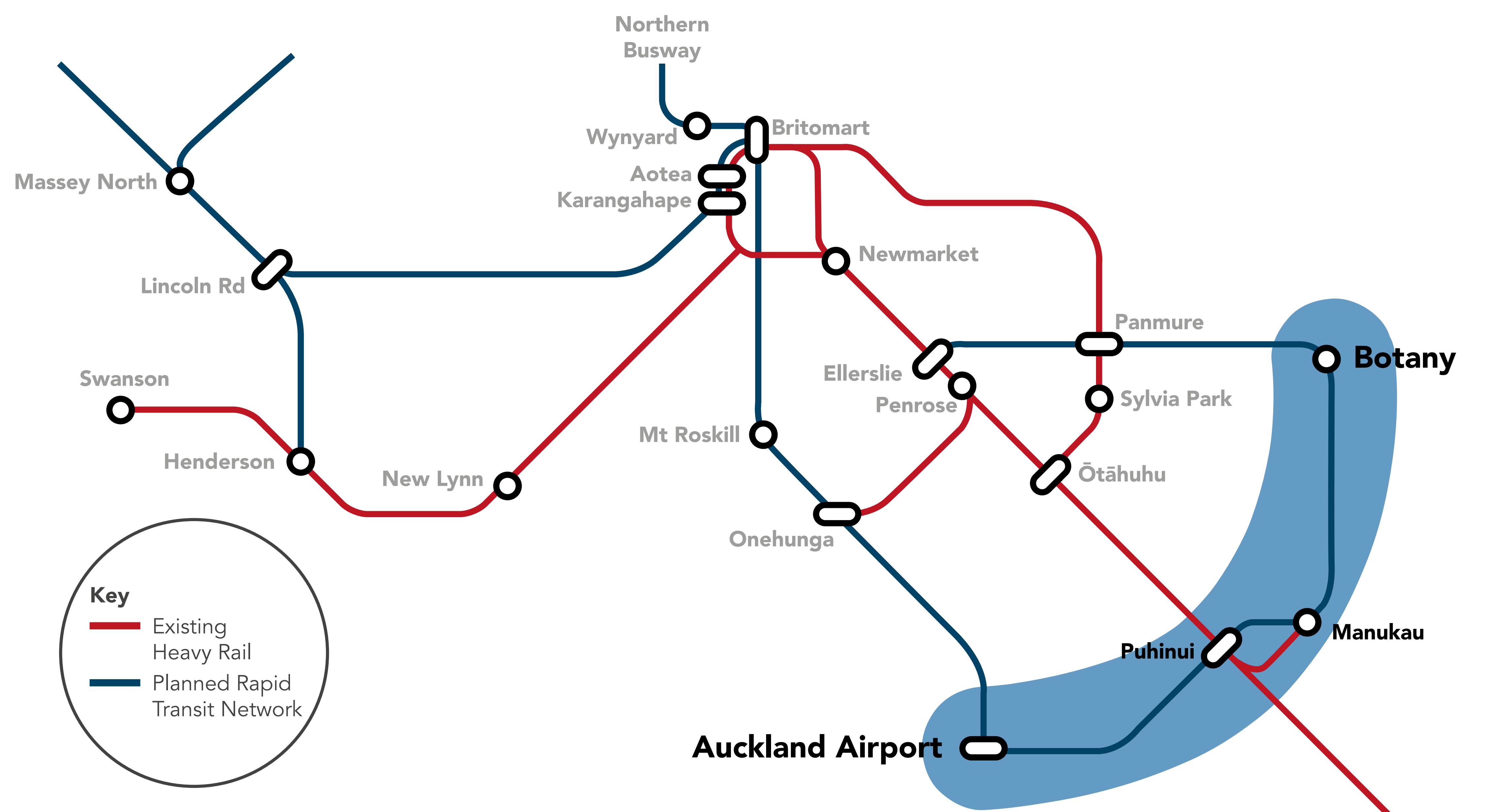
Stage 1: Early Improvements by 2020/2021:

- new bus/rail interchange at Puhinui Station
- new bus service routes (subject to funding) including a new direct bus service between the airport, Puhinui Station and Manukau
- improved walking and cycling connections.

Stage 2: Long-Term Improvements from 2021:

- rapid transit corridor protected
- staged delivery of rapid transit between the airport and Botany.
