What to bring

You must provide either:

- your New Zealand photo driver licence (can be current or expired up to 2 years), or
- your current New Zealand passport, or
- your current overseas driver licence and your current overseas passport, or
- your New Zealand birth certificate (issued on or after 1 January 1998) and a student ID card, Kiwi Access or 18+ card, power bill or bank statement*, or
- another combination of acceptable evidence of identity documents* detailed on *Identification for driver licensing* (Factsheet 20) or at www.nzta.govt.nz/identification

*If neither document has a photo, you'll also need to provide a verified image (see Factsheet 20 for more information).

What to bring (continued)

- Evidence of name change.**
If you want to change the name on your driver licence, or if the name on your identity documents isn't the same as the name on your licence, you'll need to provide acceptable evidence of name change. This must be an original (not a copy) of one of the following issued in New Zealand:
 - your marriage or civil union certificate
 - your copy of particulars of marriage or civil union
 - your dissolution of marriage or civil union order
 - a certificate of annulment
 - a deed poll certificate, change of name certificate, or birth certificate showing both names
 - a statutory declaration issued by Births, Deaths and Marriages confirming the name change.
- Note:** if your evidence of identity and name change documents don't provide a clear link to the name currently on your driver licence, you may need to provide additional documentation.

Appointment

- Theory test** You must provide one of the forms of evidence of identity listed above to the person conducting or supervising the theory test.
- Practical test** You must present either your current **photo driver licence** or your current **temporary driver licence with acceptable photo ID** (eg Kiwi Access or 18+ card, student ID card, current or expired passport) to the person conducting the practical driving test.
 - You will provide the vehicle to be used for the test. It must be covered by the highest class of licence you are applying for. If you're applying for a motorcycle licence, the motorcycle you use for a test must be a LAMS-compliant (Learner Approved Motorcycle Scheme) motorcycle.
 - The vehicle you use for the test must be clean and tidy, safe and have a current vehicle licence displayed. It must have a current certificate of fitness (CoF) or warrant of fitness (WoF) displayed and meet WoF or CoF standards. The vehicle must have a current road user charges (RUC) licence displayed if applicable.
 - If you're sitting your restricted licence practical test in an automatic vehicle your licence will only allow you to drive automatic vehicles.
- You must not be late for the appointment time shown or you won't be able to sit the test and may have to pay another test fee.**
- If you have difficulty speaking or understanding English, refer to the Tests section on page 4.

Where to apply

Take your completed form and all **original** documents to a driver licensing agent. To find an agent go to www.nzta.govt.nz/agent

The agent will process your application, check your identification, take your photo* and a sample signature for your licence. They'll also check your eyesight and book any theory or driving tests.

You must pay the fee when you make your application.

*You can't wear sunglasses, a hat, head coverings or anything that might obscure your face or prevent the photo from being a good likeness. You can wear the item for religious or medical reasons if you sign a statement confirming this, and the item doesn't prevent the photo from being a good likeness.

Tests

To prepare for the tests go to www.nzta.govt.nz/take-your-test

If you normally wear glasses or contact lenses to drive, make sure you bring them with you to the test.

Make sure you bring the right ID to the test. For more information go to www.nzta.govt.nz/test-ID

You may be able to sit your theory test in a language other than English. For more information go to www.nzta.govt.nz/theory-test

Practical tests are conducted in English. If you have difficulty speaking or understanding English you can bring an interpreter.

The testing officer may use a recording device to record your practical test. This is so we can audit testing officers and investigate complaints. If you don't want your test to be recorded, please tell the testing officer.

Changing or cancelling

If you need to change or cancel your test, please do it as early as possible, so someone else can take the test time.

For a *theory test*, go to a driver licensing agent.

For a *practical test*, go to www.nzta.govt.nz/online or a driver licensing agent.

If your licence is a truck licence (class 2-5) or motorcycle licence (class 6) there are no fees to change, cancel or rebook your test.

If your licence is a car licence (class 1), there may be a fee to change your test. If you change or cancel more than 2 full working days before the date of your test, the fees will be lower. It's free to change a practical test online if it's more than 2 full working days away.

Eyesight

You'll need to pass an eyesight check at the agent.

If you don't pass the check, you'll need to present a satisfactory eyesight or medical certificate. The certificate must be issued by a New Zealand-registered optometrist or health practitioner, and be no more than 60 days old. You can present a certificate instead of doing the eyesight check if you prefer.

If you have sight in only one eye, or have only one eye (monocular vision) you'll need to present an eyesight certificate.

Responsibilities

Driver licences make our roads safer for everyone and prove drivers are qualified and legally entitled to be behind the wheel. You must always carry your licence with you when you drive.

Your address will be recorded on the Driver Licence Register. Please notify NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) immediately if your address changes.

If your old licence is replaced by a new version, you must surrender the old version under s30 of the Land Transport Act 1998.

It's an offence to supply false or misleading information and may lead to court action. You could lose your licence or get a fine.

Email address

Giving us your email is optional. By giving us your email, you agree that NZTA may communicate with you by that email address. This includes application updates, asking for feedback, reminders and formal notices. For a full list of how we might use your email go to www.nzta.govt.nz/email-use or ask the agent. We recommend using an email address that's unique to you, so only you can see information we send you.

Privacy information

The information requested is required for NZTA (and its agents) to process your application for a driver licence, to produce your photo driver licence card, and to maintain the Driver Licence Register. Collection of this information is required by part 3 of the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999.

Your photo will be captured for the purpose of printing it onto your driver licence card. Your photo may also be used by the Department of Internal Affairs, Department of Corrections, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (Immigration), New Zealand Customs Service, and the New Zealand Police for the purposes of identity verification and law enforcement under section 200 of the Land Transport Act 1998, or for one of the purposes outlined in part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020. Your photo may therefore be disclosed to one of these agencies, for one of these purposes.

NZTA (and its agents) will hold, store, use, and disclose any personal information collected on this form in accordance with the Land Transport Act 1998 and the Privacy Act 2020 (part 7, in particular, which authorises the disclosure of this information in certain circumstances). NZTA (and its agents) may also use some of these particulars to provide you with information relating to driver licensing and driving, or to contact you for feedback on our services.

To assist in keeping the Electoral Roll up-to-date, the Electoral Enrolment Centre operates an authorised information matching programme with NZTA under s263B of the Electoral Act 1993.

To keep the Driver Licence Register up-to-date NZTA also operates an authorised information matching programme with Births, Deaths and Marriages. Please refer to the Privacy section of our website for more information.
